

Northern Ireland

The paper highlights how Northern Ireland is the poorest performing UK region for productivity, almost 20 per cent below the UK level. Low productivity is identified as central to explaining the region's persistently poor economic performance.

But it also outlines productivity gaps in the region, identifying the obstacles preventing the North West and its sub regions from gaining ground on UK average productivity levels.
